



Although not well-known, *The Merry Wives of Windsor* may be Shakespeare's funniest play, and it features one of his most popular characters: Sir John Falstaff – the fat, vain, boastful knight who believes that all women find him irresistible. Down on his luck in the rural town of Windsor, Falstaff tries to seduce and swindle two housewives. But the joke is on him when the Mistresses Ford and Page catch on to Falstaff's scheme and teach him some lessons with deceptions of their own. And it all concludes at night in a forest full of mischievous fairies. Sound familiar? *The Merry Wives of Windsor* is Shakespeare's only play set in his own country and time: Elizabethan England.

The Music Man was a Broadway hit in 1957, earning five Tony Awards, including Best Musical. The cast album won the first Grammy Award for "Best Original Cast Album" and was number one on the Billboard charts for 245 weeks. (*Ya Got Trouble, Til There Was You, and 76 Trombones* are just a few of the many hit songs in the score.

An affectionate tribute to small town America of a bygone era, this is the story of Professor Harold Hill, a fast-talking travelling salesman. He plans to swindle the people of River City into buying instruments and uniforms for a boys band that will never materialize. But the confidence man's scheme unravels when he falls in love with Marian the Librarian. Funny, warm, touching, and romantic, *The Music Man* is family entertainment at its best.
