Program Accreditation – Accreditation Commission on Education in Nursing

- Every 8 years
- Recent visit on October 19-21, 2021
- Program was found to be compliant in all six standards
- Final report will be available April 2022

CWC Nursing Program Outcomes

- **EOPSLOs**
 - Safety Provide safe nursing care within the healthcare system.
 - Clinical Judgment Incorporate prior knowledge, current research, and clinical experience in decision-making.
 - Leadership Demonstrate leadership skills as part of an interprofessional team to promote desired outcomes.
 - Patient Centeredness Use effective communication and advocacy to provide individualized care.
 - Professionalism Practice within the core values, principles, and standards of the nursing profession.
 - Health Promotion Utilize the nursing process and a broad knowledge base to maximize health.
- SPE Review Data is analyzed to determine if students are on track to meet EOPSLOs, and for data-driven program improvement. We assess each outcome in various ways throughout the program and then compare against the NCLEX report, which tells us how our students actually performed.
 - Safety we include calculation proficiency, performance of standardized testing so that we can compare across programs nationally, as well as longitudinally across our cohorts. All ELAs were met.
 - Clinical Judgment we look at pharmacology, reduction of risk potential, evidence-based practice, Clinical performance, critical thinking. All ELAs were met.

- Leadership includes teamwork and collaboration, management of care, and principles of team leadership. All ELAs were met.
- Patient Centeredness analyze student performance in psychosocial and mental health, basic care and comfort, medical surgical care, OB, peds and community. All ELAs were met.
- Professionalism readiness for professional practice, nursing process, mass casualty event
- Health Promotion health promotion and maintenance data, patient education, etc.


End of Program Outcomes

 - 80% of graduates will meet or exceed the required pass rate on the NCLEX-RN on the first attempt.

Program Completion

- ELA:
 - 65% of students who enter first-semester nursing courses will complete the program on time within four semesters.
 - 80% of advanced placement students who enter the program in third-semester nursing courses will complete the program on time within two semesters.
 - o 2020 67.4%
 - Discussion related to points for active CNA and how that is beginning to increase admittance to programs of active healthcare employees. A small increase is beginning to be seen, S. Graham in Jackson is not sure about how it is working for them, but has 3-4 CNAs that will be great nurses and is using this to encourage them to continue their education.

Employment after Graduation

- ELA:
 - 80% of graduates are employed as registered nurses within six months of program completion.
 - o 2020 100%
