

A Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant is different from other federal student grants because it requires you to agree to complete a teaching service obligation as a condition for receiving the grant, and if you don't complete the service obligation, the TEACH Grant will be converted to a loan that you must repay, with interest.

- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form
- Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 (submit your latest transcript confirming your GPA)
- Be enrolled in a TEACH-Grant-eligible program
- Complete Teach Grant Initial and Subsequent Counseling each year that I receive a TEACH Grant at www.studentaid.gov
- Sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve or Repay (Agreement) at www.studentaid.gov
